Background

Ghana over the last few year has made strides in the development of its Internet infrastructure. From the government perspective, the National Information technology Agency (NITA) was established by an act of parliament in 2008 to develop government Infrastructure and regulate the growing ICT sector. Since its inception, NITA has created a nation-wide 4G LTE network infrastructure spanning across 125 out of the 216 districts in Ghana. NITA has also built high speed Metropolitan Area fiber network in Accra, Tamale and Kumasi and an Eastern corridor fiber optic cable spanning across the country to speed up the uptake of ICT in the Eastern corridor of Ghana. A national datacenter which is arguably the largest in the West Africa sub-region has been built by the government for both public and private sector organization to speed-up ICT development. A number of e-service application have been deployed and more are being deploy in area passport acquisition, driver's license acquisition, communication license renewal to mention but a few.

From the private sector, with six mobile operators, and 5 submarine cables operators, Ghana has a mobile penetration of 132% and Mobile data penetration of 69%. Internet pricing remain relatively higher even though an Alliance for Affordable Internet (A4AI) initiative have been working with all stakeholders to bring down price of Internet. Cybersecurity remains a priority for almost all government across the globe. In Ghana a draft policy is waiting for accent by cabinet. A child online protection national steering committee has been inaugurated to draft a framework and an action plan.

The Ghanaian Academic and research network (GARNET) has put in place a switch at the National Datacenter to connect all tertiary institutions to share research and connect to the west and central African research network (WACREN) and ultimately to the global education networks.

As the connectedness of Ghana become more complex, there is an increasing need to governance issues to be discuss with the view of removing any bottlenecks that will hinder the development of the Internet.

Introduction

Against the background of an increasing network connectedness in Ghana, the Ghana IG Forum 2016 was organized under the theme “Building a multi-stakeholder model for the development of the Internet”. The event was jointly convened by the Internet Society Ghana Chapter represented by its chairman, Prof. Nii Quaynor and the Ministry of Communications represented by its Chief Director, Issah Yahaya. The event was held at Kofi Annan Centre of Excellence in ICT (AITI-KACE) on 18th August, 2016.

Organization & Sponsorship

Under the oversight of the Adhoc National Steering Committee of the Ghana IG Forum, the planning committee organized the 2016 Forum. The Adhoc Steering committee made up of four institutional head from Academia, Business and government, approved this year program which comprised four sub-themes and 14 sessions. The sub-themes were as follows:

- Youth and IGF
- Access and Diversity
- Cybersecurity and cyber safety
- Critical Internet Infrastructure

A total of 50 speakers, presenters and panelists participated in the event with about 215 active participants. About 20 persons participated remotely

The Planning committee chaired by the National Communication Authority comprised members from 7 different organization in the ecosystem including media, business, regulator and Internet critical infrastructure operators. The committee worked tirelessly with the secretariat to raise funds, prepare the meeting place and ensured that all the technical fitting was working properly. A full list of Steering and Planning committees is attached as Appendix B

A total of GHS42, 000 (USD10,500) was raised from our sponsors to offset the cost of hosting the event. The Sponsors were as follows:



Participation

The Secretariat invited all CEOs of mobile network operators and ISPs as well as all chief Director of Ministries departments and agencies to attend the Forum. An online registration form was created on the Ghana IGF Forum website for the public to register. A half page newspaper Ad of the event was place in the Daily Graphic, Ghana's largest circulating newspaper and also announce on several mailing lists.

Over 220 participants attended the Forum. Below is the distribution of participation.

Outcome of the Ghana IGF 2016

The IGF was organized in four sub-thematic areas:

- Youth IGF
- Access and Diversity
- Security and Safety
- Critical Internet Infrastructure

During the opening ceremony, the UN IGF MAG Chair, Lynn St. Amour, who participated remotely indicated that sustainable development of Internet is paramount and advocated national, regional and international collaborations and exchange of information as input for policies.

The Deputy Minister of Communications, Hon. Ato Sarpong, who represented the Minister of Communications said Ghana was lagging behind at the development of the Internet in Ghana and said the acquisition of an appropriate broadband model is very necessary for nationwide coverage to bridge the rural-urban educational, economic and social gaps.

Youth IGF

Under the Youth IGF sub-thematic area, two parallel sessions took place. The e-Learning session concluded that a National effort to harness the content of technology to spur on e-learning nationwide should be to: "Repackage, Repurpose and Reprioritize"

In the "Youth and IGF: taking stock" session, there was a general conclusion that establishment an internet governance academy for the youth to teach healthy expressions and actions on the internet will ensure responsible use.

The general conclusions of the other thematic areas were as follows:

Access and diversity:

- a. Everyone must be mindful of protecting the internet infrastructure in the ground to improve quality of service.
- b. There is the need to look out on hidden taxes on the implementation of bridging the divide.
- c. The Internet is a necessity and not a luxury and its tariff regime should be treated like other utilities like electricity and water and made affordable.
- d. Urgent reforms needed to achieve UN 2020 Internet for all goal

Critical Internet Infrastructure

- Need to create awareness of the .gh Internet Registry so people can use them instead of generic domains
- Multi-stakeholder model should be fashioned to allow all stakeholders in the Academic community to play their roles effectively for the benefit of the community in setting up the education peering.
- GARNET to promote strong links for knowledge sharing and research development and to enhance e-learning, libraries should have internet
- Need for transition plan involving all stakeholders with government of Ghana taking the lead. must have a plan. In addition, the government and private sectors ought to have a plan.
- Need for cloud computing platforms in Ghana so more students can use the internet to complete their school assignments

Security and online Safety

- Need to include cyber security in the curriculum at various levels of the education system so citizenry will appreciate the issues
- Need for sharing threat information among various stakeholders
- Children must be encouraged to report cases of violence and other forms of abuse on social media to their parents

- There should be multi-stakeholder committee to facilitate a coherent Child Online Protection action in Ghana
- ICT teachers should be technology savvy and they should teach technology. A national educational forum for ICT teachers would be helpful and in addition, promotion of ICT
- Need for Organizations to be sensitized on the need to set up Computer Emergency Response Teams (CERT) to provide preventive and reactive solutions when there is an incidence
- Possibility of including rigorous cybersecurity regulatory clauses to be enforced in regulated environments

Way Forward

Issues on building a multi-stakeholder model, the secretariat will submit a proposal to the Ministry of Communications to setup a multi-stakeholder governing council to replace the current Steering committee in a framework that will ensure that planning committee members are rotated after two years. The recommendations also will include a well-resource secretariat and a coordinator appointed by the Governing Council for a fixed term. The communique which is being reviewed will also be submitted to the ministry as recommendations from the meeting.
